About us

'We believe in giving communities a chance to be self-sustainable. We believe that an individual deserves the right to education, healthcare and to reside in a safe environment.'

Families affected by HIV and AIDS are still facing discrimination, prejudice and stigma daily. This can cause serious problems with obtaining employment and being accepted in their own communities and with their families.

Our work is focused on supporting mothers and their babies and children in families affected by HIV/AIDS and Malaria by:

1. Aiding the advancement of citizenship or community development by promotion of community capacity building which in turn provides the relief of poverty- *Provision of farming starter kits in a farming and market town community*
2. Aiding the advancement of education- *Providing children's clothes/school uniforms, shoes and learning materials so students can attend school primary school*
3. *Aiding the advancement of health and saving lives- Providing mosquito bed nets to prevent individuals contracting malaria*

We are a totally self-funded organisation that has developed out of love for a welcoming African community during our travels and volunteer work overseas in the dusty town of Ifakara.

We travel out to Ifakara every other year and distribute mosquito bed nets and children's clothes/school uniforms, shoes and school learning supplies.

Donation and Fundraising 2015/2016

We are now an HMRC registered UK charity and also registered with *BT mydonate* and *Just Giving* donation websites.

We do receive a number of generous donated funds from independent donors and fundraisers annually and we also carry out fundraising activities ourselves. We really appreciate the efforts of these generous individuals and groups and we are very pleased with the fundraising that occurred in 2015/2016.

In May runners Gabby and Frank took to the streets of Manchester with hundreds of others to complete the annual Manchester 10K run. They raised £138 and ran in record time.

In October a brave individual, James, solo cycled 200 miles all the way from Aberystwyth to Manchester and raised an amazing £322

During the summer, we launched our Marrakech Half Marathon campaign to find runners prepared to raise sponsorship and run 13 miles in Morocco in January 2016. Five budding young runners- Frank (again!), Andy, Mark and Gary successfully completed this challenge and raised a whopping £2510.

All the funds raised in 2015/2016 will go towards two of our permanent campaigns we have running:

- **Tanzanian Primary School Support-** Uniforms, shoes and learning supplies for up to 60 primary school children
- **A Good Start In Life-** Mosquito bed nets for new mums, their babies & children

Future fundraising plans and projects

Child Aid Tanzania has shown increasing progression over the past few years and we three feel that 2016/2017 will be an even more promising year for our charity.

We have the following fundraising activities planned:

1. 'My Manchester' Charity Photo exhibition- Budding photographers of all ages will have the opportunity to enter their photos and showcase them in our fundraising competition
2. Women's group Caribbean afternoon tea with female guest speaker talking about ethnic women's health and social issues

We have the following projects planned:

1. Rebranding our permanent campaigns:
 - **Tanzanian Primary School Support**- Uniforms, shoes and learning supplies for up to 60 primary school children
 - **A Good Start In Life**- Mosquito bed nets for new mums, their babies & children
 - **Self Sufficient Communities**- Providing farming starter kits to struggling farmers
2. Working with an Ifakara women's group and Toilet Twinning to build a communal toilet and washing facility for one village community.
3. Developing an E-book aimed at individuals volunteering in Tanzania in the health/Medical field and education sectors

We envisage the upcoming year to be challenging yet exciting and rewarding. We would like to say a very big thank you to you, our donors, fundraisers; friends and family who help us strengthen capacity building in these Tanzanian communities by keeping the Ifakara and Manchester link strong. We couldn't do what we do without you all.
